Thank you for being a part of this journey. Together, we can create a world free from exploitation and harm.

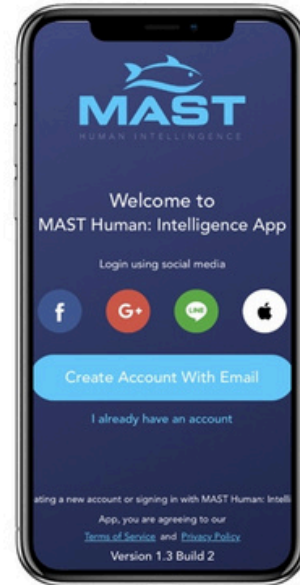
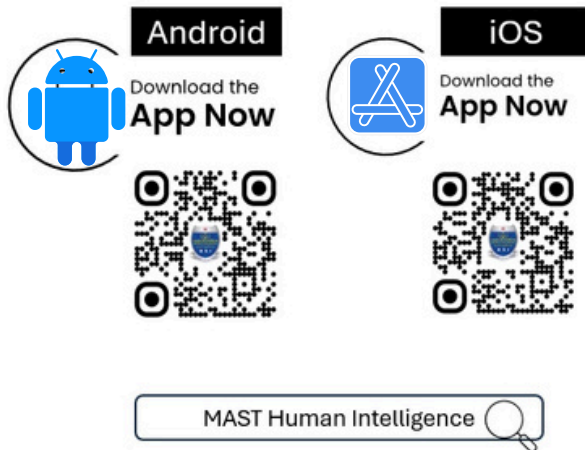

A Powerful Tool to Combat Human Trafficking and Protect the Vulnerable Workers

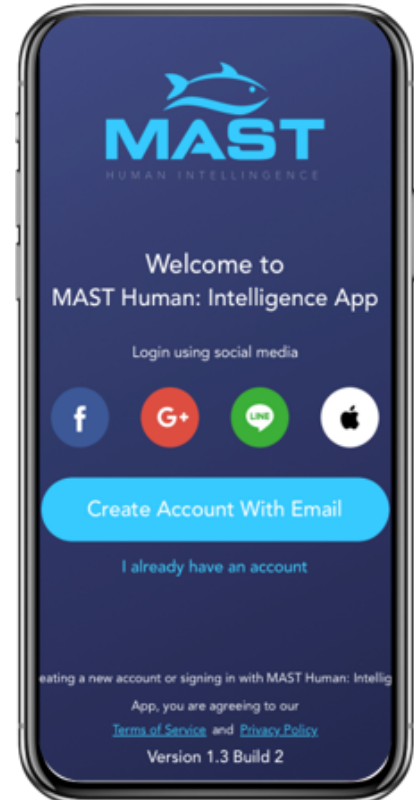
Human trafficking is a serious problem that affects millions of people around the world, especially in Southeast Asia. According to the Global Slavery Index, there are an estimated 610,000 people living in conditions of modern slavery in Thailand. Many of them are exploited in the fishing sector, where they face harsh working conditions, physical abuse, and a lack of legal protection.

To address this issue, MAST Human, a nonprofit social venture that was formerly recognized as the Multi-Stakeholder Initiative for Accountable Supply Chain of Thai Fisheries (MAST), has developed a mobile application called the MAST Human Intelligence App. This app serves as an effective tool for tracking the safety and well-being of workers, specifically designed to enhance the protection and prevention of labor rights and human rights violations, including human trafficking, for vulnerable workers.

The MAST Human Intelligence App adopts a worker-centric approach that empowers workers and targets criminals. It utilizes data collection and predictive behavior modeling to provide real-time assistance to individuals in need. The app has numerous features, such as location tracking, emergency alerts, criminal reporting, worker education, and crowdsourcing communication. The MAST Human Intelligence App is available in English, Thai, Khmer, and Burmese languages, which can cater to the diverse linguistic backgrounds of the workers. The app is also encrypted and secure, which can protect the privacy and safety of the users.

The MAST Human Intelligence App is a groundbreaking mobile application that serves as a powerful tool to combat human trafficking and protect vulnerable workers in the fishing sector and other industries in Southeast Asia. Thanks to the generous support from Edge Case Capital Partners and the App Company, and the integrated collaboration of the Department of Special Investigation (DSI) and the Ministry of Labor of Thailand, as well as the DSI's People Networks for Crime Prevention in Thailand and aboard.

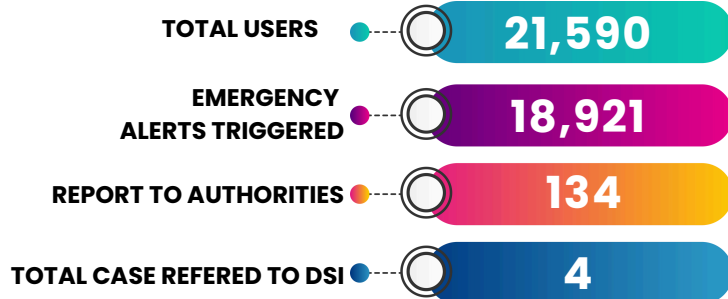

MAST HUMAN AT REGIONAL AND GLOBAL FORUMS IN 2024

Throughout 2024, MAST Human actively engaged with key regional and global platforms, reinforcing our commitment to combating human trafficking and transnational organized crime. By leveraging technology and fostering collaboration, we expanded our impact and strengthened partnerships with governments, international organizations, and civil society actors.

One of our most significant milestones was introducing the MAST Human Intelligence App at major ASEAN regional summits and global forums. These events provided opportunities to showcase our innovative approach to integrating real-time intelligence, secure data-sharing, and multi-stakeholder engagement into anti-trafficking efforts. Our participation helped drive discussions on how digital tools can enhance victim identification, law enforcement responses, and corporate due diligence in preventing labor exploitation.

At the 12th Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Convention against Transnational Organized Crime (UNTOC) in Vienna, held from October 14-18, 2024, we addressed a global audience on the importance of cross-sector collaboration in tackling organized crime. MAST Human emphasized collective action, trust-building, and secure data-sharing between the public sector and civil society as crucial elements in protecting vulnerable populations. This engagement solidified our role as a key player in shaping international strategies to combat trafficking and forced labor. Additionally, we played an active role in ASEAN-wide dialogues focused on labor rights and supply chain accountability, particularly in industries vulnerable to exploitation. Our efforts in the Finnish berry-picking industry and other high-risk sectors were presented as case studies, highlighting the need for stronger regulatory frameworks and technology-driven monitoring mechanisms.

Furthermore, MAST Human participated in global discussions on technology and human rights, engaging with stakeholders in Europe, North America, and Asia to explore ethical AI applications in anti-trafficking work. These interactions helped foster collaborations with law enforcement agencies, private sector leaders, and humanitarian organizations, paving the way for enhanced partnerships in 2025.

By positioning MAST Human at the forefront of regional and global dialogues, we continue to drive policy changes, advocate for victim-centered approaches, and



THE 2024 SOUTH CHINA SEA REGIONAL EXCHANGE ON FISHERIES GOVERNANCE MANILA, PHILIPPINES

16-19 JANUARY 2024



MAST Human was honored to participate in the 2024 South China Sea Regional Exchange on Fisheries Governance, held in Manila, Philippines, from January 16-19, 2024, and organized by the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID).

This event served as a critical platform for discussing common approaches to international and regional challenges affecting the fisheries sector.



During the exchange, MAST Human showcased the MAST Human Intelligence App as an innovative, technology-driven solution to combat human trafficking and forced labor in the fishing industry. We demonstrated how the app enhances monitoring, improves data integrity, and facilitates secure information-sharing, emphasizing the role of digital tools in strengthening labor rights protections and regulatory enforcement within the sector.



Additionally, the Ecosystem Approach to Fisheries Management (EAFM) working group of the Coral Triangle Initiative on Coral Reefs, Fisheries, and Food Security (CTI-CFF) sought technical support to enhance the integrity of fish stocks and foundational ecosystems in the Coral Triangle region.

The Regional Plan of Action to Prevent, Deter, and Eliminate Illegal, Unreported, and Unregulated Fishing (RPOA-IUU), and the South China Sea sub-regional working group, also requested technical assistance in advancing sustainable fisheries management practices.



Through our engagement in this remarkable forum, MAST Human reinforced the importance of leveraging technology and collaboration to address labor exploitation and promote ethical, sustainable fishery and good governance across the region.

MAST Human Recognized by the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), Vienna, International women's day 2024

MAST Human was honored to receive recognition from the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) for our efforts in combating human trafficking. The UNODC website in Vienna published an article titled "MAST Human: Leveraging Technology to Help Victims of Human Trafficking in Thailand," which highlighted our innovative approach to using technology to protect vulnerable individuals and disrupt trafficking networks, including our public-private partnership approach to addressing human trafficking.

This recognition was especially significant as it was featured in connection with International Women's Day 2024, underscoring the impact of MAST Human as a woman-led organization. Our leadership in the fight against human trafficking reflects the critical role that women play in driving change, advocating for justice, and leveraging technology for social good. The article reinforced MAST Human's global standing as a leader in anti-trafficking efforts and celebrated our commitment to creating a safer, more just world for all—especially for those most at risk of exploitation.



MAST HUMAN: LEVERAGING TECHNOLOGY TO HELP VICTIMS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING IN THAILAND

Thailand has long grappled with significant challenges linked to human trafficking, notably within industries such as fishing and seafood processing. Numerous independent reports have shed light on instances of forced labor, exploitation, and human trafficking within the Thai fishing sector. According to the Global Slavery Index, an estimated 610,000 individuals endure conditions of modern slavery in Thailand, with many subjected to exploitation within the fishing sector.

Addressing these issues head-on is MAST Human, a nonprofit social venture dedicated to tackling the root causes of human trafficking and illegal, unreported, and unregulated (IUU) fishing in Southeast Asia. Formerly known as the Multi-Stakeholder Initiative for Accountable Supply Chain of Thai Fisheries (MAST), MAST Human was founded in March 2016 as a visionary coalition. Led by founder and executive director Dornnapha Sukkree, MAST Human employs a collaborative approach, drawing upon the collective expertise of on-the-ground experts from civil society and reputable professional consultancies. Through robust and constructive action, MAST Human activates solutions aimed at empowering fishing communities to combat human trafficking. Dornnapha provides legal training for lawyers, increasing awareness through advocacy and other means.

Technological empowerment

MAST Human leverages technology to aid victims of human trafficking. Ms. Sukkree's firm belief in technology's potential for prevention led to collaboration with Edge Case Capital Partners, a California-based tech company. Together, they developed the MAST Human Intelligence App, tailored to track worker safety and welfare while preventing labor rights violations and human trafficking. Additionally, the app serves as a communication platform, fostering workplace awareness and empowering workers to overcome vulnerabilities.

The app adopts a worker-centric approach, empowering individuals while targeting criminals. Utilizing data collection and predictive behavior modeling, it offers real-time assistance to those in need, with features including location tracking, emergency alerts, criminal reporting, worker education, and cloud-based communication. The app caters to diverse linguistic backgrounds, available in English, Thai, Khmer, and Burmese languages, while its encrypted and secure design ensures user privacy and safety. Within a few months, the app garnered 12,000 users, leading to investigations prompted by user alerts. Presently, the organization aims to expand their user base to 100,000 active users, focusing on bulk automation and engaging law enforcement. This expansion will enable to extend the coverage in the fishing industry and other sectors in the future. During the COVID-19 pandemic, the MAST Human Intelligence App proved to be invaluable for workers.

Working together

MAST Human collaborated with the Thai Government, civil society organizations, and international entities such as the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) from the start. Participating in the State Self-Inspection Course at the UN Convention

"Tragically, the government is essential, as they have obligated our functions that align with our objectives," says Ms. Sukkree. "Collaborating with stakeholders from diverse backgrounds allows us to share change collectively, even if we don't always see eye to eye on every aspect. Learning from previous experiences and engaging with organizations like UNODC provides valuable insights into compliance requirements and how our goals align with their objectives."

"When combating organized crime, emerging technology plays a crucial role," Ms. Sukkree notes. "Our technology has gained attention in the fishing industry, particularly from the Thai Government and International Agencies. Engaging with government departments and participating in global conferences like the fish process has opened doors for collaboration and innovation."

Calling interest and attention becomes easier when incorporating process technology that can make a difference. While it is, their contributions to government efforts, such as innovation, rescue, or prosecution, would be limited. The technology enables MAST Human to facilitate successful prosecutions and collaborations with NGOs, creating crucial conversations and dialogues. Overcoming challenges lies in bridging the gap between traditional NGO work and innovative technology solutions.

Alternative ways to fight human trafficking

Recently MAST Human got involved with the Tourism Authority of Thailand and local authorities in Marine Conservation and introduced innovative approaches focused on community advocacy and education by using workers as a driving force to combat human trafficking and promote sustainable fishing. By empowering communities with alternative income sources, we address livelihoods and alleviate poverty – the root cause of trafficking. This holistic strategy, through increased efficiency addresses interconnected issues. With technology and resource allocation, we can empower stakeholders and their progress jointly," emphasizes Ms. Sukkree.

Collaboration with law enforcement, both domestically and internationally, is essential in addressing issues such as forced labor and human trafficking. While primary focus of MAST Human is Thailand, their adaptable solutions can benefit governments worldwide. Engaging with civil society organizations can further amplify their impact and foster collaborative and ethical and effective technological solutions.

SEA SUNDAY CELEBRATION 2024

MAST Human, in collaboration with **The Mission to Seafarers Thailand** and **Thailand Eagles Club**, and with the cooperation of **the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment, the Department of Fisheries, the Royal Thai Navy, and the Manglai Crab Bank Community** organized the **Sea Sunday Festival Celebration on Saturday, July 13, 2024**. The event honored the sacrifices of seafarers, fishermen, and the workers behind the international shipping and fishing industries, while also promoting marine conservation and community resilience.

The festival began with a prayer ceremony to bless seafarers, fishermen, and maritime workers, followed by key conservation activities. Participants took part in the release of mother crabs and egg-bearing baby crabs from the Manglai Crab Bank, as well as a beach cleanup using sand-sieving tools provided by the Department of Fisheries. A major highlight of the event was the launch of the MAST Human's two boats, made from recycled plastic, symbolizing our commitment to sustainability. A group of 35 participants boarded these boats to access the mangrove planting area, where together they planted approximately 1,500 mangrove saplings.

Following this, participants visited the Manglai Crab Bank to learn about local fishing practices, marine resource conservation, and the community's efforts to sustain healthy coastal ecosystems. The event concluded with a fresh seafood meal provided by the Manglai fishing community, fostering camaraderie and appreciation for the people whose livelihoods depend on the sea. Additionally, MAST Human and the participants donated life jackets to the Manglai fishing community to support their safety at sea.

This event was a pivotal moment for MAST Human, as it deepened our understanding of how climate change directly impacts coastal communities. It marked the beginning of our journey to address and mitigate climate change by working alongside local communities to build climate-resilient societies. By integrating technology, conservation, and community engagement, we are committed to creating sustainable solutions that protect both people and the environment.

As part of a distinguished panel alongside Anti-Slavery Australia, ASEAN-ACT, and Investors Against Trafficking, we engaged in meaningful discussions with business leaders and ESG investors. The session explored strategies for strengthening national support systems for survivors, enhancing corporate accountability, and integrating survivor-centered approaches into responsible business practices.

MAST Human emphasized the critical role of technology and cross-sector collaboration in identifying, protecting, and empowering survivors, reaffirming our commitment to advancing human rights and ethical business practices across the Asia-Pacific region.





THE 12TH CONFERENCE OF THE PARTIES TO THE UN TRANSNATIONAL ORGANIZED CRIME CONVENTION

Vienna, Austria | October 14–18, 2024



MAST Human was honored to participate in the 12th Conference of the Parties to the UN Transnational Organized Crime Convention, organized by the United Nations, in Vienna, Austria, from October 14–18, 2024.

On October 15, 2024, Ms. Dornnapha Sukkree, Executive Director addressed member states from 197 countries and approximately 220 civil society organizations. During her speech, she highlighted MAST Human's collaboration with the Department of Special Investigation (DSI) in driving innovative solutions to combat human trafficking and forced labor. She emphasized the importance of building cooperation between the public and civil sectors, particularly through public-private partnerships, to address and mitigate human trafficking effectively.

As we leverage technology to combat human trafficking, MAST Human has learned over the years that integrity and secure data sharing are crucial. At this forum, Ms. Sukkree urged member states to build trust and establish protocols for data sharing between public authorities and civil society, as the heinous crime of human trafficking requires collective action. She also introduced the MAST Human Intelligence App to the global community, calling on state parties to recognize the critical role of civil society in combating human trafficking and supporting survivor-centric solutions.

This forum reaffirmed our commitment to advocating for collaboration among stakeholders and strengthening global partnerships to protect vulnerable populations from exploitation and abuse.
